IMITATE CHRIST'S MERCY

On this Second Sunday of Easter, we are called to love with the heart of God throughout our lives

Pope Francis in a homily remarked that "Jesus' invitation to mercy is intended to draw us into a deeper imitation of God our Father: Be merciful, as your Father is merciful."

This basic insight into mercy has been contemplated for centuries. Mercy, wrote St. Ambrose in the fourth century, "is a good thing, for it makes men perfect, in that it imitates the perfect Father. Nothing graces the Christian soul so much as mercy."

The words "mercy" and "merciful" appear around 150 times in Scripture. Hesed, or tender mercy, is God's greatest characteristic in the Old Testament. For example, Moses was told that the Lord is "merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness" (Ex 34:6). King David, who knew something about sin and justice, wrote, "Have mercy on me, O God, according to thy steadfast love; according to thy abundant mercy blot out my transgressions" (Ps 51:3). This mercy is boundless and undeserved compassion; in the New Testament it is called agape, which is pure love.

To be merciful is to love with the heart of God, which is why Jesus, in the Beatitudes, stated, "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy" (Mt 5:7). To be blessed is to share in the very life of God, and God is perfect love and unfathomable mercy. St. Peter, in today's Epistle, also connects the two, writing, "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who in his great mercy gave us a new birth to a living hope ..." April 27, 2014 Second Sunday of Easter/Divine Mercy Sunday Acts 2:42-47 PS 118:2-4, 13-15, 22-24 1 Pt 1:3-9 JN 20:19-31.

Mercy, of course, does not ignore sin; on the contrary, mercy addresses and overcomes sin. The Son, by becoming man and being willing to die for the sins of the world, exhibited mercy in a most remarkable manner. Our new birth to a real and living hope, remarked Peter, is "through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you ..."

We show mercy to others, not by ignoring or downplaying their sins, but by loving them and helping them to embrace God's gift of forgiveness.

The month of April is dedicated to The Holy Spirit. The first four days of the month fall during the season of Lent which is represented by the liturgical color purple — a symbol of penance, mortification and the sorrow of a contrite heart. The rest of April falls in the Easter season in which white, the color of light, a symbol of joy, purity, and innocence, is the liturgical color.

April boasts the most solemn and sublime event of human history: the Resurrection of Jesus Christ – the Paschal mystery. Though the way to the Resurrection was the Via Crucis, the Sacrificial Lamb of God is now and forever Christ our Light, the Eternal high priest of

the New Covenant. And his sorrowful mother, the Stabat Mater of Good Friday, is now the jubilant Mother of the Regina Caeli.

We the members of Christ's Mystical Body exalt in the mystery by which we were redeemed. If in Baptism we were buried with Christ, so also will we share in his resurrection. By his death we were reborn; "by his stripes we were healed." (Is 53:5) Easter, the epicenter of time, is the event that links time and eternity. It is indeed "the day the Lord has made; let us be glad and rejoice in it." (Ps 118:24) ☐

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE MONTH

THE CONQUEST OF JESUS CHRIST

All the great religious leaders of history have one thing in common: they are dead. Only one man has risen from a grave never again to taste death. Jesus Christ rose again! God validated His Kingship and accepted His payment for our sins with one incredible stroke: He raised Jesus from the dead!

Acts 4 reveals five things that are true right now because Jesus is alive...

HIS PERSECUTION CONTINUES

It is impossible to persecute a dead man — he's beyond your reach! But Jesus continues to be persecuted. The Bible makes it clear. When Saul had been persecuting early believers, Jesus Himself said on the road to Damascus, "Saul, Saul, why persecutest thou Me?"

In Acts 3, a miracle occurred right at the door of the Temple. The religious establishment was angry. Peter and John made sure everyone knew Jesus was responsible for it.

Peter...answered...why marvel ye at this...as though by our own power or holiness we had made this man to walk? (3:12)

Peter's words cut like saber as he told them, "through faith in His name" (v. 16), Jesus, who they had put to death, had healed the lame man and "God has raised [Him] from the dead; whereof we are witnesses" (v. 15). The reaction was persecution.

...the priests, and the captain of the temple, and the Sadducees came upon them, being grieved that they taught the people and preached through Jesus the resurrection from the dead. Acts 4:1-2

Because Jesus Christ is alive, He is still being persecuted. The apostles received the brunt of it, but in the truest sense, it was the Lord Jesus being persecuted. When you persecute the church, you're persecuting Jesus.

If you're not being persecuted, don't boast about it, for the Bible says "all who live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution." If there's no persecution, it's not because the world has gotten more "churchy," but the church has gotten more worldly.

HIS PREACHING CONVINCES

How many of them which heard the word believed...about five thousand. (4:4)

How were these unlettered fishermen able to preach and five thousand come to Christ? Because He lives. They were not dependent upon their power of oratory, winsomeness or logic. There was a living Christ inside them.

HIS POWER CONFRONTS

The religious hierarchy thought they were done with Jesus. At the Crucifixion they had said, "If you're the Son of God, come down from the cross." They should have gone to the tomb and said, "If you're the Son of God, come out." With this miracle they were confronted by the power of the living Christ.

The living Christ is still doing miracles. "Neither is there salvation in any other: for there is none other name under heaven given among men, whereby we must be saved" (v. 12) — not in Abraham, Moses, Buddha or Mohammed. Jesus is not a good way to heaven. Jesus is the only way to heaven.

HIS PRESENCE COMPELS

"And when they saw the boldness of Peter and John...they marveled; and they took knowledge of them, that they had been with Jesus." (v. 13)

When you're in the presence of Jesus Christ, something happens to you. His presence will compel you. Shortly before this, Peter cursed, swore, and denied the Lord Jesus. But now he had seen the risen Lord, and he was compelled.

In our churches today we need an epidemic of holy boldness — people unashamed of the Lord Jesus Christ — from spending time in His presence.

HIS PEOPLE CONFESS

The leaders had said, "You can't preach a risen Lord." ("...Let us staidly threaten them..." v. 14.) Why? Because of the power of that message. You might as well have told the sun not to shine.

"But Peter and John answered...we cannot but speak the things which we have seen and heard" (v. 20). Why? Because they'd seen Him. A witness tells what he's seen and heard. You could not shut them up.

"And daily...and in every house, they ceased not to teach and preach Jesus Christ" (5:42). Here's the way the early church worked:

Leaders: "You can't do it."

Disciples: "We're going to do it."

Leaders: "We forbid you."

Disciples: "We're still going to do it."

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GOD TOUCHED ME

GOD'S WILL IS THAT EVERYONE WHO TRUSTS IN HIM BE ABLE TO HAVE CHILDREN

***Worship the Lord your God and His blessing will be upon your food and water.
I will take sickness from among you, and none will miscarry and be barren in
your land. I will give you a full life span.***

Exodus 23:25, 26

I had been away from the Church for a couple of years and my relationship with the Lord was not as strong as it once was when my friend Denise told me about The Spiritual Army of God the Father ministry. She told me that its leader, affectionately addressed as Tito Vic [by most devotees] has the gift of locution. He receives messages from God and Mother Mary; and that he knew things about angels and heaven. I could see how positively affected Denise was by this and her passion for the Lord that I decided to come to one of the 1st Saturday devotions. I was curious and intrigued because my husband and I had been trying to get pregnant for some time and Denise said that the locutionist could do a pray over for me to ask God for help.

There was a part of me that did not want to wake up early on a Saturday morning to go to Mass because that was my day to sleep in, but something told me to go and I also promised Denise [and my other friend, Maybel] I would be there. I didn't know what to expect especially from the cenacle, but it turned out to be very positive and interesting with a humorous touch and everyone was so nice and supportive that I decided to come regularly.

The first pray over touched me that I cried. I could feel that this was real and a higher power was at work. My message was from Jesus and that I should ask for what I wanted because He was a giving God. Denise explained that I needed to start praying and to go to church regularly. After the message was given, Tito Vic said that my first baby will be a girl, then I'll have a boy, and if I wanted then I would have another girl; but he said that he didn't see me having them in the near future - that it would be a couple of years. This made me so happy, but I wanted to become pregnant sooner since my biological clock is ticking away! I was moved to go to church regularly and to pray the rosary daily.

A couple of months later, I had my second pray over. The message that our Lord Jesus gave this time was that my prayers will be answered soon and that I would see signs of His Sacred Heart to confirm it. Denise believed that because I was doing what the Lord asked of me, He would answer my prayers sooner than expected.

Everything came into fruition exactly the way Tito Vic said it would. A few months later, after seeing a Reproductive Specialist, I became pregnant!

Before I knew I was pregnant, I, of course had restless days – doubting the IUI procedure will be successful. During one of those days, I happened to see the movie *Philomena*¹, and just around everywhere in the movie was the Sacred Heart of Jesus. And this calmed me. I knew then it was Jesus' way of reminding me to trust in His Word!

I was filled with happiness and joy, but a couple of months into my pregnancy I went into Emergency because I was bleeding a lot. This definitely scared me and made me sad. I don't know if it was God's way of testing me to see if I really wanted this pregnancy, but I knew in my heart no harm will come to me and my baby because God guards me with His angels and my safety comes from the Lord. Denise contacted everyone to pray for me and the prayers helped tremendously. Maybel also gave me a lot of Novenas to pray. As I prayed, I trusted God is wonderfully forming my baby in my womb, mighty is our seed, strong and healthy is our child!

Tito Vic told me that Saint Elizabeth had a baby later in life so somewhere in this child's name, he graciously proposed that "Elizabeth" should be in it. On January 14, 2015, Skylar Elizabeth Ciridon Daley was born weighing 9 pounds 10 ounces and 20 inches. She is my miracle and the love of my life! I thank God for her every day!

SPIRITUAL ENRICHMENT RECOMMENDED

PRAYING IN RESURRECTION JOY

“He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.’...So they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy...”

Matthew 28:7-8

How perfectly Matthew captures the essence of our encounter with the empty tomb! We are fearful yet overjoyed.



Through the season of Lent we were invited to unite our sufferings with the suffering of our Lord. The

old self had to die, like the grain of wheat in the parable, so that it could yield a rich harvest (John 12:24). The Easter season is the time of reaping. Our tears turn to joy as we see that the stone has been rolled away, the tomb is empty, the wrappings of burial and death are left behind, the Master is risen, and he is inviting us to share his resurrected life.

But isn't it also true, as Matthew intimates, that our resurrection joy is tinged with a sort of fear? What does it mean for us to step out of the tombs in which we have been lain — or into which we may willingly have entered? What are the death wrappings we have discarded through our Lenten practices of almsgiving, fasting, and prayer? We may be tempted to look behind and grieve the loss of the old. But St. Paul in 2 Corinthians implores us to look ahead: “So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see, everything has become new!” (5:17). That is God's Easter promise to us!

Throughout the 50 days of the Easter season, we are invited to celebrate the reality of new creation in our own lives, our re-creation as the children of God, having moved through Baptism from death to new life in Christ. Even as we may fear entering into this new world, uncharted but for the fact that our Risen Lord goes always before us, how might we pray our resurrection joy?

- Easter comes in the midst of spring. How can the new life rising out of the earth — green shoots and crocuses, lilies, and daffodils — inspire us to prayer? What newness is springing forth in your soul?

- The Risen Christ bears in his resurrected body the scars of his crucifixion (John 20:27). We too may bear the scars of our former life of sin and death. We can ask the Lord in prayer to show us how he might use our scars to lead others to share in our trust that our God can make all things new.
- How do you best experience a sense of praise and gratitude toward God? Do you feel called to sing and dance like David? To create works of art? To keep a gratitude journal? What is one practice you could continue or add to your life of prayer that celebrates the truth that God is renewing creation in you?

IMITATE CHRIST'S MERCY

Fifteen years ago this month, Pope John Paul II officially established this Second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, recognizing the private revelations given by Jesus to St. Faustina Kowalska (1905-38). The Polish nun saw two rays of light shining from the heart of Christ, which, he explained to her, "represent blood and water." John Paul II reflected upon her visions, writing: "Blood and water! We immediately think of the testimony given by the Evangelist John, who, when a soldier on Calvary pierced Christ's side with his spear, sees blood and water flowing from it (cf. Jn 19:34). Moreover, if the blood recalls the sacrifice of the cross and the gift of the Eucharist, the water, in Johannine symbolism, represents not only baptism but also the gift of the Holy Spirit (cf. Jn 3:5; 4:14; 7:37-39)."

Pope John Paul II emphasized that the divine mercy is radically demonstrated in God's sacrificial self-gift, flowing from the heart of the Father, who is "rich in mercy" (Eph 2:4). In his 1980 encyclical *Dives in Misericordia* ("On the Mercy of God"), John Paul II wrote that Jesus Christ not only spoke of mercy, "but above all, he himself makes it incarnate and personifies it. He himself, in a certain sense, is mercy" (No. 2). And we, in turn, are to be witnesses to that mercy, in word and deed. ☐
